City of Stockton Accepting Applications for San Joaquin County Commission on Aging

(Stockton, CA) - The City of Stockton is responsible for appointing one (1) of the twenty-two (22) members to the San Joaquin County Commission on Aging. Applicants of varied ethnic and/or racial backgrounds are sought to fill this vacancy. The term of office is for three (3) years. The application deadline is Wednesday, September 14, 2011 at 5:30p.

Commission members serve as advocates for senior citizens and advise both the County Board of Supervisors and the San Joaquin County Department of Aging on issues relating to the senior population. The Commission also acts as the County Long-Term Care Coordinating Council/Adult Day Health Care Planning Council and advises the Board of Supervisors on long-term care. Meetings are held on the first Monday of each month at the Human Services Agency. There is no remuneration. The cost of parking in City lots during regularly scheduled meetings is borne by the San Joaquin County Department of Aging and Community Services.

Applications are available online at www.stocktongov.com, or, from the Office of the City Clerk, City Hall, 425 N. El Dorado Street, 1st floor, Stockton. Applicants must reside within the City of Stockton and not hold any position of employment with the City of Stockton, nor be an elected official of the City. Qualified applicants will be interviewed by the City Clerk in September. Selection and appointment will be made by the City Council at a regularly scheduled Council meeting within four weeks after the interviews are held.

City offices are open Monday through Thursday, 7:30a – 5:30p, and every other Friday, 8a – 5p. City offices will be closed Labor Day, September 5, and Friday, September 7, 2011.
